Mr. BARTON of Texas introduced the following bill; which was referred to the
Committee on Energy and Commerce

A BILL

To repeal the Cable Television Consumer Protection and
Competition Act of 1992.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Cable Consumer Pro-
5 tection and Competition Act of 1993”.

6 **SEC. 2. REPEAL OF 1992 CABLE REREGULATION LAW.**

7 (a) REPEAL.—Except as provided in subsection (c),
8 the Cable Television Consumer Protection and Competi-
9 tion Act of 1992 is repealed.

1 (b) EFFECT OF REPEAL; RESTORATION OF PRIOR
2 LAW.—Except as provided in subsection (c), each section
3 of the Communications Act of 1934 amended by the Cable
4 Television Consumer Protection and Competition Act of
5 1992 shall be applied as if the Cable Television Consumer
6 Protection and Competition Act of 1992 had not been en-
7 acted.

8 (c) RETRANSMISSION CONSENT.—Notwithstanding
9 subsection (a), section 6 of the Cable Television Consumer
10 Protection and Competition Act of 1992 is not repealed.

11 **SEC. 3. REGULATIONS RESCINDED.**

12 Any regulations prescribed by the Federal Commu-
13 nications Commission to implement amendments made by
14 the Cable Television Consumer Protection and Competi-
15 tion Act of 1992 (other than section 25 thereof) shall
16 cease to be effective on the date of enactment of this Act.
17 The Commission shall promptly act to amend or rescind
18 its regulations as necessary to comply with this Act.
