A BILL

To amend the Consumer Product Safety Act to authorize the Consumer Product Safety Commission to regulate the risk of injury associated with firearms.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Gun Safety Act of
5 1993”.

6 **SEC. 2. FIREARMS.**

7 (a) AUTHORITY TO REGULATE.—Section 3(a)(1)(E)
8 of the Consumer Product Safety Act (15 U.S.C.
9 2052(a)(1)(E)) is repealed.

1 (b) CONFORMING AMENDMENTS.—

2 (1) CONSUMER PRODUCT SAFETY ACT.—Section
3 3(a)(1) of the Consumer Product Safety Act (15
4 U.S.C. 2052(a)(1)) is amended by striking out “de-
5 scribed in subparagraph (E) of this paragraph or”.

6 (2) AMENDATORY ACT.—Section 3(e) of the
7 Consumer Product Safety Commission Improve-
8 ments Act of 1976 (15 U.S.C. 2080 note) is re-
9 pealed.

10 **SEC. 3. PROHIBITION AGAINST BANNING OF A FIREARM.**

11 Section 8 of the Consumer Product Safety Act (15
12 U.S.C. 2057) is amended by adding at the end thereof
13 the following: “This section shall not apply in the Commis-
14 sion’s regulation of the risk of injury associated with fire-
15 arms.”.
