Mr. SANDERS introduced the following bill; which was referred jointly to the Committees on Post Office and Civil Service and House Administration

A BILL

To provide that rates of pay for the President and Members of Congress shall be made equivalent to the rates of pay for their counterparts in the United Mexican States if legislation implementing the North American Free Trade Agreement is enacted.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. METHOD FOR DETERMINING RATES OF PAY.**

4 (a) FOR THE PRESIDENT.—Section 102 of title 3,
5 United States Code, is amended by striking “compensa-
6 tion in the aggregate amount of \$200,000 a year,” and
7 inserting “compensation equivalent to the annual rate of

1 pay (as of the start of such term) for the President of
2 the United Mexican States.”.

3 (b) FOR MEMBERS OF CONGRESS.—Subsection (a) of
4 section 601 of the Legislative Reorganization Act of 1946
5 (2 U.S.C. 31) is amended to read as follows:

6 “(a)(1) The annual rate of pay for service in any
7 Congress as—

8 “(A) a Senator shall be equivalent to the an-
9 nual rate of pay in effect, as of the start of such
10 Congress, for a Senator in the Congress of the
11 Union of the United Mexican States; or

12 “(B) a Member of the House of Representatives
13 shall be equivalent to the annual rate of pay in ef-
14 fect, as of the start of such Congress, for a Deputy
15 in the Congress of the Union of the United Mexican
16 States.

17 “(2) For the purpose of this subsection, the term
18 ‘Member of the House of Representatives’ includes a Dele-
19 gate to the House of Representatives and the Resident
20 Commissioner from Puerto Rico.”.

21 **SEC. 2. CONDITION PRECEDENT; EFFECTIVE DATE.**

22 (a) CONDITION PRECEDENT.—The amendments
23 made by section 1 shall not take effect unless the United
24 States enacts legislation implementing the North Amer-
25 ican Free Trade Agreement.

1 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—If the condition under sub-
2 section (a) is met—

3 (1) the amendment made by section 1(a) shall
4 take effect as of the beginning of the first term be-
5 ginning after the date of the enactment of this Act;
6 and

7 (2) the amendment made by section 1(b) shall
8 take effect as of the beginning of the first Congress
9 beginning after the first election of Representatives
10 which occurs after the date of the enactment of this
11 Act.
