Mr. JACOBS introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee
on the Judiciary

A BILL

For the relief of Sara Lou Hendricks.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. PAYMENT OF POSTAL SAVINGS ACCOUNT**
4 **PROCEEDS.**

5 The Secretary of the Treasury shall pay, out of any
6 money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, the
7 proceeds of the postal savings account of the late Harriet
8 C. McKee (account number 442), and interest calculated
9 under section 4, to Sara Lou Hendricks, the daughter and
10 heir of Harriet C. McKee.

1 **SEC. 2. SATISFACTION OF CLAIMS.**

2 The payment made pursuant to section 1 shall be in
3 full satisfaction of all claims Sara Lou Hendricks may
4 have against the United States, or any agent or agency
5 of the United States, relating to the postal savings account
6 described in section 1.

7 **SEC. 3. LIMITATION ON AGENT AND ATTORNEY FEES.**

8 It shall be unlawful for an amount exceeding 10 per-
9 cent of the payment required by section 1 to be paid to
10 or received by any agent or attorney for any service ren-
11 dered in connection with the payment required by section
12 1. Any person who violates this section shall be guilty of
13 an infraction and shall be subject to a fine in the amount
14 provided in title 18, United States Code.

15 **SEC. 4. CALCULATION OF INTEREST.**

16 The interest on the account referred to in section 1
17 shall equal the sum of—

18 (1) the interest that would have been payable
19 on the account for the period beginning on the day
20 that the account was opened and ending on the last
21 day that the proceeds of postal savings accounts
22 could be claimed under the Postal Savings System
23 Statute of Limitations Act (98 Stat. 402), if the ac-
24 count had been claimed under the Postal Savings
25 System Statute of Limitations Act (98 Stat. 402);
26 and

1 (2) interest calculated according to the formula
2 in section 2516(b) of title 28, United States Code,
3 for the period beginning on the 1st day after the end
4 of the period described in paragraph (1) and ending
5 on the day that the payment required by section 1
6 is made.

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
