## A BILL

To correct the tariff treatment of certain articles covered by the Nairobi Protocol.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. CERTAIN ARTICLES COVERED BY THE NAIROBI**

4 **PROTOCOL.**

5 The superior text to subheadings 9817.00.92,  
6 9817.00.94, and 9817.00.96 of the Harmonized Tariff  
7 Schedule of the United States is amended by inserting be-  
8 fore the colon the following: “, parts thereof, and acces-  
9 sories thereto”.

1 **SEC. 2. APPLICABILITY.**

2 (a) IN GENERAL.—Except as provided in subsection  
3 (b), the amendment made by section 1 applies with respect  
4 to articles entered, or withdrawn from warehouse for con-  
5 sumption, on or after the 15th day after the date of the  
6 enactment of this Act.

7 (b) RETROACTIVE PROVISION.—Notwithstanding sec-  
8 tion 514 of the Tariff Act of 1930 or any other provision  
9 of law, upon proper request filed with the appropriate cus-  
10 toms officer within 180 days after the 15th day after the  
11 date of the enactment of this Act, any entry or with-  
12 drawal—

13 (1) that was made after August 11, 1985, and  
14 before such 15th day; and

15 (2) with respect to which there would have been  
16 no duty if the amendment made by section 1 applied  
17 to such entry or withdrawal,  
18 shall be liquidated or reliquidated as though such amend-  
19 ment applied to such entry or withdrawal.
