## A BILL

To cancel the Space Station program.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. CANCELLATION.**

4 The Space Station program is hereby cancelled.

5 **SEC. 2. REPORT ON TERMINATION COSTS.**

6 Within 1 month after the date of enactment of this  
7 Act, the Administrator of the National Aeronautics and  
8 Space Administration shall submit to the Congress a re-

1 port itemizing the funding required for carrying out the  
2 cancellation of the Space Station program. Such report  
3 shall include details of the purposes for which such funds  
4 are needed, and any requests for funding in addition to  
5 amounts authorized by this Act that may be required.

6 **SEC. 3. REPORT ON TOTAL SPACE STATION COSTS.**

7       Within 1 year after the date of enactment of this Act,  
8 the Administrator of the National Aeronautics and Space  
9 Administration shall submit to the Congress a report de-  
10 tailing all Federal expenditures relating to the Space Sta-  
11 tion from October 1, 1982, through the final cancellation  
12 of the program.

13 **SEC. 4. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.**

14       There are authorized to be appropriated to the Ad-  
15 ministrator of the National Aeronautics and Space Admin-  
16 istration \$500,000,000 for costs associated with carrying  
17 out section 1 of this Act.
