## A BILL

To amend the Small Business Act to eliminate restrictions on providing financial assistance to small business concerns engaged in media-related industries.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SMALL BUSINESS CONCERNS ENGAGED IN**  
4 **MEDIA-RELATED INDUSTRIES.**

5 (a) ELIGIBILITY FOR FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE.—Sec-  
6 tion 3 of the Small Business Act (15 U.S.C. 632) is  
7 amended by adding at the end the following new sub-  
8 section:

1       “(n) MEDIA-RELATED CONCERNS.—For purposes of  
2 this Act, a small business concern shall not be considered  
3 ineligible for financial assistance, including loans under  
4 section 7(a), solely on the basis that the concern is en-  
5 gaged in a broadcast, print, or other media-related indus-  
6 try.”.

7       (b) REPEAL OF OPINION MOLDER RULE.—Not later  
8 than 60 days after the date of the enactment of this Act,  
9 the Administrator of the Small Business Administration  
10 shall—

11           (1) issue regulations to repeal section 120.101–  
12           2(b) of title 13, Code of Federal Regulations; and

13           (2) take such other actions as may be necessary  
14           to carry out the amendment made by subsection (a).
