A BILL

To direct the Secretary of Health and Human Services to carry out a demonstration project under which physicians providing services to individuals entitled to benefits under the medicare program will receive regular information on charges submitted by and payments made to other providers who furnish services to such individuals.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. ESTABLISHMENT OF DEMONSTRATION**
2 **PROJECT ON MEDICARE REFERRAL RE-**
3 **PORTS.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than January 1, 1995,
5 the Secretary of Health and Human Services (hereafter
6 in this Act referred to as the “Secretary”) shall establish
7 a demonstration project under which, with respect to pro-
8 viders of physicians’ services for which payment may be
9 made under part B of title XVIII of the Social Security
10 Act within the designated area of the project, the Sec-
11 retary shall periodically furnish a medicare referral report
12 (as described in subsection (b)) to the provider on any in-
13 dividual entitled to benefits under such title to whom the
14 provider furnishes such services during the period the
15 project is in effect (subject to subsection (c)). The Sec-
16 retary shall furnish such reports upon the request of a
17 provider of physicians’ services under such title and at
18 such other times as the Secretary may consider appro-
19 priate.

20 (b) MEDICARE REFERRAL REPORT DESCRIBED.—

21 (1) IN GENERAL.—In this section, a “medicare
22 referral report” means, with respect to an individual,
23 a report (in such format as the Secretary may estab-
24 lish) containing the following information:

25 (A) Any item or service furnished to the
26 individual during the period the project is in ef-

1 fect for which payment may be made under title
2 XVIII of the Social Security Act.

3 (B) The identity of the individual or entity
4 furnishing such item or service.

5 (C) The illness, injury, or condition (in-
6 cluding any applicable diagnostic code) on
7 which the furnishing of the item or service is
8 based.

9 (D) The amount of payment made for the
10 item or service under such title.

11 (E) The amount of charges submitted to
12 the Secretary with respect to the item or service
13 (if any) by the individual or entity furnishing
14 the item or service.

15 (2) FORMAT.—A medicare referral report shall
16 be provided in such electronic and printed formats
17 as the Secretary may establish, and shall be fur-
18 nished to a provider in the format the provider
19 specifies.

20 (c) PATIENT CONSENT REQUIRED.—

21 (1) IN GENERAL.—No medicare referral report
22 may be furnished under the project with respect to
23 information relating to any individual unless the in-
24 dividual has provided written consent to the Sec-

- 2 evaluating the effectiveness of treatments.

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
