Mr. SOLOMON introduced the following bill; which was referred to the  
Committee on Government Operations

## A BILL

To prohibit federally sponsored research pertaining to the  
legalization of drugs.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. FINDINGS.**

4 The Congress finds that—

5 (1) the sale, possession and use of drugs pose  
6 a pervasive and substantial threat to the social, edu-  
7 cational, and economic health of the United States;

8 (2) the impact of drug abuse is reflected in the  
9 violence that it causes and in the disintegration of  
10 families, schools, and neighborhoods;

1           (3) the effects of rampant drug use is amply il-  
2           lustrated by national violent crime statistics across  
3           the United States;

4           (4) the overwhelming majority of health care  
5           and law enforcement experts agree that drug legal-  
6           ization would have disastrous consequences for the  
7           people of the United States; and

8           (5) recent studies demonstrate that drug use by  
9           young people is on the rise in the United States.

10 **SEC. 2. RESTRICTION.**

11           Notwithstanding any other provision of law, no de-  
12           partment or agency of the United States Government shall  
13           conduct or finance, in whole or in part, any study or re-  
14           search involving the legalization of drugs.
