Mr. BEILENSON (for himself, Mr. BERMAN, Mr. BECERRA, Mr. FILNER, Ms. ROYBAL-ALLARD, Mr. FARR, Ms. SCHENK, Mr. DELLUMS, Mr. DIXON, Mr. PASTOR, and Ms. VELÁZQUEZ) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

A BILL

To provide for enhanced enforcement of the immigration laws.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Immigration Enforce-
5 ment Act of 1994”.

6 **SEC. 2. STRENGTHENED ENFORCEMENT OF IMMIGRATION**

7 **LAWS**

8 (a) INCREASED PERSONNEL LEVELS OF THE BOR-
9 DER PATROL.—The number of full-time officer positions
10 in the Border Patrol of the Immigration and Naturaliza-

1 tion Service for fiscal year 1995 shall be increased to
2 6,000 positions.

3 (b) INCREASED PERSONNEL LEVELS OF THE INS
4 ANTISMUGGLING PROGRAM.—The number of full-time po-
5 sitions in the antismuggling program of the Immigration
6 and Naturalization Service for fiscal year 1995 shall be
7 increased to 600 positions.

8 (c) INCREASED FUNDING LEVELS FOR THE BORDER
9 PATROL.—(1) In addition to funds otherwise available for
10 such purposes, there are authorized to be appropriated to
11 the Attorney General, \$170,000,000 for each of fiscal
12 years 1995, 1996, 1997, 1998, and 1999, for equipment
13 (such as ground sensors and related equipment, vehicles,
14 low level light television systems, hand-held night vision
15 equipment, vehicle-mounted infrared equipment), support
16 services, and initial training for the Border Patrol.

17 (2) In addition to funds otherwise available for such
18 purposes, there are authorized to be appropriated to the
19 Attorney General, \$30,000,000 for each of fiscal years
20 1995, 1996, 1997, 1998, and 1999 for maintenance and
21 repair of equipment used by the Border Patrol.

22 (3) Funds appropriated pursuant to this subsection
23 are authorized to remain available until expended.

24 (d) INSERVICE TRAINING FOR THE BORDER PA-
25 TROL.—(1) Section 103 of the Immigration and National-

1 ity Act (8 U.S.C. 1103) is amended by adding at the end
2 the following new subsection:

3 “(e)(1) The Attorney General shall provide for such
4 programs of inservice training for full-time and part-time
5 personnel of the Border Patrol in contact with the public
6 as will familiarize the personnel with the rights and varied
7 cultural backgrounds of aliens and citizens in order to en-
8 sure and safeguard the constitutional and civil rights, per-
9 sonal safety, and human dignity of all individuals, aliens
10 as well as citizens, within the jurisdiction of the United
11 States with whom they have contact in their work. In de-
12 veloping such training, the Attorney General shall consult
13 with organizations familiar with the varied cultural back-
14 grounds of such aliens and citizens or which have experi-
15 ence providing services to such aliens and citizens.

16 “(2) The Attorney General shall include a description
17 of steps taken to carry out paragraph (1) in the annual
18 report of the Service.”.

19 (2)(A) There are authorized to be appropriated to the
20 Attorney General to carry out the inservice training de-
21 scribed in section 103(e) of the Immigration and National-
22 ity Act \$5,000,000 for fiscal year 1995.

23 (B) Funds appropriated pursuant to subparagraph
24 (A) are authorized to remain available until expended.
