## A BILL

To extend until June 30, 1995, the temporary suspension of duties on self-folding telescopic shaft collapsible umbrellas.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. EXTENSION OF TEMPORARY SUSPENSION OF**  
4 **DUTIES ON SELF-FOLDING TELESCOPIC**  
5 **SHAFT COLLAPSIBLE UMBRELLAS.**

6 Heading 9902.66.01 of the Harmonized Tariff  
7 Schedule of the United States is amended by striking out  
8 “12/31/92” and inserting “6/30/95”.

1 **SEC. 2. EFFECTIVE DATE.**

2 (a) IN GENERAL.—The amendment made by section  
3 1 applies with respect to goods entered, or withdrawn from  
4 warehouse for consumption, on or after the 15th day after  
5 the date of the enactment of this Act.

6 (b) RELIQUIDATION.—Notwithstanding section 514  
7 of the Tariff Act of 1930 (19 U.S.C. 1514) or any other  
8 provision of law, upon proper request filed with the appro-  
9 priate customs officer on or before the date which is 90  
10 days after the date of the enactment of this Act, any entry,  
11 or withdrawal from warehouse for consumption, of an arti-  
12 cle described in heading 9902.66.01 of the Harmonized  
13 Tariff Schedule of the United States that was made—

14 (1) after December 31, 1992, and before the  
15 15th day after the date of the enactment of this Act,  
16 and

17 (2) with respect to which there would have been  
18 no duty if the amendment made by section 1 applied  
19 to such entry or withdrawal,  
20 shall be liquidated or reliquidated as though such amend-  
21 ment applied to such entry or withdrawal.
