A BILL

To suspend through September 30, 1995, the duty on certain textile manufacturing machinery.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SUSPENSION OF DUTY ON CERTAIN TEXTILE-**

4 **MANUFACTURING MACHINERY.**

5 Subchapter II of chapter 99 of the Harmonized Tar-
6 iff Schedule of the United States is amended by inserting
7 in numerical sequence the following new heading:

“	9902.84.53	Used machinery for the manufacture of nonwoven textiles by hydroentanglement, valued at not more than \$800,000 each (provided for in subheading 8449.00.50)	Free	No change	No change	On or before 9/30/95	”.
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1 **SEC. 2. EFFECTIVE DATE.**

2 (a) IN GENERAL.—The amendment made by section
3 1 shall apply with respect to goods entered, or withdrawn
4 from warehouse for consumption, on or after the date that
5 is 15 days after the date of the enactment of this Act.

6 (b) RETROACTIVE PROVISION.—Notwithstanding sec-
7 tion 514 of the Tariff Act of 1930 or any other provision
8 of law, upon proper request filed with the Customs Service
9 within 180 days after the date of the enactment of this
10 Act, any entry, or withdrawal from warehouse for con-
11 sumption, of goods described in heading 9902.84.53 of the
12 Harmonized Tariff Schedule of the United States (as
13 added by section 1)—

14 (1) which was made after October 15, 1993,
15 and before the date that is 15 days after the date
16 of the enactment of this Act, and

17 (2) with respect to which there would have been
18 no duty if the amendment made by section 1 applied
19 to such entry or withdrawal,
20 shall be liquidated or reliquidated as if such amendment
21 applied to such entry or withdrawal.
