Mr. STUMP introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Public Works and Transportation

A BILL

To prohibit the expenditure of Federal funds for constructing or modifying highway signs that are expressed only in metric system measurements.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. METRIC SYSTEM SIGNING.**

4 (a) No Federal funds may be expended to construct,
5 erect, or otherwise place any sign relating to any speed
6 limit, any distance, or any other measurement, on any
7 highway if such sign establishes such speed limit, distance,
8 or other measurement solely using the metric system.

9 (b) No Federal funds may be expended to modify any
10 sign relating to any speed limit, any distance, or any other

1 measurement on any highway for the conversion of such
2 sign solely to the metric system.

3 (c) For purposes of subsections (a) and (b)—

4 (1) the term “highway” means a highway as
5 defined in section 101 of title 23, United States
6 Code; and

7 (2) the term “metric system” means metric sys-
8 tem of measurement as defined in section 4 of the
9 Metric Conversion Act of 1975 (15 U.S.C. 205c).
