## AN ACT

To require the Secretary of the Interior to convey the  
Corning National Fish Hatchery to the State of Arkansas.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4       This Act may be cited as the “Corning National Fish  
5 Hatchery Conveyance Act of 1994”.

6       **SEC. 2. CONVEYANCE OF CORNING NATIONAL FISH HATCH-**

7                               **ERY TO STATE OF ARKANSAS.**

8       (a) CONVEYANCE REQUIREMENT.—The Secretary of  
9 the Interior shall convey to the State of Arkansas, without  
10 reimbursement and by no later than December 31, 1994,  
11 all right, title, and interest of the United States in and  
12 to the property described in subsection (b), for use by the

1 Arkansas Game and Fish Commission as part of the State  
2 of Arkansas fish culture program.

3 (b) PROPERTY DESCRIBED.—The property referred  
4 to in subsection (a) is the property known as the Corning  
5 National Fish Hatchery (popularly known as the William  
6 H. Donham State Fish Hatchery), located one mile west  
7 of Corning, Arkansas, on Arkansas State Highway 67 in  
8 Clay County, Arkansas, consisting of 137.34 acres (more  
9 or less), and all improvements and related personal prop-  
10 erty under the control of the Secretary that is located on  
11 that property, including buildings, structures, and equip-  
12 ment.

13 (c) REVERSIONARY INTEREST OF UNITED STATES.—  
14 All right, title, and interest in property described in sub-  
15 section (b) shall revert to the United States if the property  
16 ceases to be used as part of the State of Arkansas fish  
17 culture program. The State of Arkansas shall ensure that  
18 the property reverting to the United States is in substan-  
19 tially the same or better condition as at the time of trans-  
20 fer.
