Mr. THOMAS of California (for himself, Mr. DOOLEY, Mr. DOOLITTLE, and
Mr. MCCRERY) introduced the following bill; which was referred jointly
to the Committees on Foreign Affairs, Energy and Commerce, Natural
Resources, and Merchant Marine and Fisheries

A BILL

To remove the restrictions on the export of Alaskan North
Slope oil, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. EXPORT ADMINISTRATION ACT AMENDMENT.**

4 Section 7(d) of the Export Administration Act of
5 1979 (50 U.S.C. App. 2406(d)) is repealed.

6 **SEC. 2. TRANSPORT REQUIREMENT.**

7 Any domestically produced crude oil that is trans-
8 ported by pipeline over right-of-way granted pursuant to
9 section 203 of the Trans-Alaska Pipeline Authorization

1 Act (43 U.S.C. 1652) shall, if exported, be transported
2 in vessels eligible to engage in the coastwise trade that
3 are documented under the laws of the United States.

4 **SEC. 3. OTHER PROVISIONS OF LAW.**

5 The export of domestically produced crude oil trans-
6 ported by pipeline over right-of-way granted pursuant to
7 section 203 of the Trans-Alaska Pipeline Authorization
8 Act (43 U.S.C. 1652) shall not be subject to the restric-
9 tions contained in section 28(u) of the Mineral Leasing
10 Act of 1920 (30 U.S.C. 185(u)), section 103 of the Energy
11 Policy and Conservation Act (42 U.S.C. 6212), section 28
12 of the Outer Continental Shelf Lands Act (43 U.S.C.
13 1354), or section 7430(e) of title 10, United States Code,
14 or any regulations issued under any such provision of law.

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
