Mr. TRAFICANT introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

## A BILL

To provide for an additional temporary and permanent district court judgeship for the northern district of Ohio.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. PERMANENT JUDGESHIP FOR THE NORTHERN**

4 **DISTRICT OF OHIO.**

5 The existing district judgeship for the northern dis-  
6 trict of Ohio authorized by section 203(c) of the Federal  
7 Judgeship Act of 1990 (28 U.S.C. 133 note) shall, as of  
8 the date of the enactment of this Act, be authorized under  
9 section 133 of title 28, United States Code, and the in-  
10 cumbent in that office shall hold the office under section

1 133 of title 28, United States Code, as amended by this  
2 Act.

3 **SEC. 2. TEMPORARY JUDGESHIP.**

4 The President shall appoint, by and with the advice  
5 and consent of the Senate, 1 additional district judge for  
6 the northern district of Ohio. The first vacancy in the of-  
7 fice of district judge in the northern district of Ohio which  
8 occurs 5 years or more after the date of the enactment  
9 of this Act shall not be filled.

10 **SEC. 3. AMENDMENT TO TABLE.**

11 In order that the table contained in section 133(a)  
12 of title 28, United States Code, will reflect the change in  
13 the number of permanent district judgeships authorized  
14 as a result of section 1, the item relating to the northern  
15 district of Ohio in such table is amended by striking "11"  
16 and inserting "12".
