Mr. GLICKMAN introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence

## A BILL

To require the specific identification of intelligence community construction projects in annual budget submissions and the authorization by law of such projects.

1        *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2        *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3        SECTION 1. No project for the construction of any  
4        facility, or improvement to any facility, having an esti-  
5        mated Federal cost in excess of \$250,000, may be under-  
6        taken in any fiscal year unless such project is specifically  
7        identified as a separate item in the President's annual fis-  
8        cal year budget request and is specifically authorized by

1 the Congress, if such facility or improvement would be  
2 used primarily by personnel of the intelligence community.

3 SEC. 2. As used in this section, the term “Intelligence  
4 community” has the same meaning given that term in sec-  
5 tion 3(4) of the National Security Act of 1947 (50 U.S.C.  
6 401a(4)).
