Mr. HOCHBRUECKNER introduced the following bill; which was referred to the  
Committee on the Judiciary

## A BILL

For the relief of Jack Ellsworth.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       **SECTION 1. PAYMENT OF CLAIM.**

4       The Secretary of the Treasury shall pay, out of any  
5       money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, to  
6       Jack Ellsworth of Patchogue, New York, the sum of  
7       \$100,000, to compensate Jack Ellsworth regarding a lease  
8       agreement he signed with the National Park Service in  
9       anticipation of receiving a radio broadcasting license that  
10      was later awarded to another entity by the Federal Com-  
11      munications Commission. The payment required by this  
12      section shall be in full satisfaction of any claim Jack Ells-

1 worth or the Long Island Music Broadcasting Corporation  
2 may have against the United States, or any agent or  
3 agency of the United States, in connection with the lease  
4 agreement or the radio broadcasting license referred to in  
5 this section.

6 **SEC. 2. LIMITATION ON AGENT AND ATTORNEY FEES.**

7       It shall be unlawful for an amount exceeding 10 per-  
8 cent of the payment required by section 1 to be paid to  
9 or received by any agent or attorney for any service ren-  
10 dered in connection with the payment. Any person who  
11 violates this section shall be guilty of an infraction and  
12 shall be subject to a fine in the amount provided in title  
13 18, United States Code.
