1 **SECTION 1. EXEMPTION FROM LIMITATION ON INCURRED**
2 **EXPENSES FOR MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES**
3 **UNDER MEDICARE FOR MENTAL HEALTH**
4 **SERVICES FURNISHED TO NURSING HOME**
5 **RESIDENTS.**

6 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 1833(c) of the Social Se-
7 curity Act (42 U.S.C. 1395l(c)) is amended by inserting
8 after “hospital” the following: “or a resident of a nursing
9 facility (as defined in section 1919(a))”.

10 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by
11 subsection (a) shall apply to expenses for mental health
12 services incurred in calendar years beginning with 1994.
