A BILL

To amend the United States Housing Act of 1937 to exclude from consideration as family income for purposes of Federal housing assistance programs certain rebates and refunds for the cost of State property taxes paid through rent.

2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Homestead Rebate Ex-
5 emption Act of 1993”.

1 **SEC. 2. EXCLUSION OF PROPERTY TAX REBATES FROM IN-**
2 **COME.**

3 Section 3(b)(5) of the United States Housing Act of
4 1937 (42 U.S.C. 1437a(b)(5)) is amended—

5 (1) in subparagraph (F), by striking “and” at
6 the end;

7 (2) in subparagraph (G), by striking the period
8 at the end and inserting “; and”; and

9 (3) by adding at the end the following new sub-
10 paragraph:

11 “(H) any amounts received after January
12 1, 1993, by the family in the form of refunds
13 or rebates under State or local law for property
14 taxes paid through rent on the dwelling unit of
15 the family.”.
