Mrs. JOHNSON of Connecticut (for herself and Mrs. KENNELLY) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means

A BILL

To temporarily suspend the duty on certain lead fuel test assemblies.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. CERTAIN LEAD FUEL TEST ASSEMBLIES.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding section 514 of
5 the Tariff Act of 1930 (19 U.S.C. 1514) or any other pro-
6 vision of law, the Secretary of the Treasury shall—

7 (1) liquidate or reliquidate as free of duty any
8 entry of any partially assembled lead fuel assembly
9 (described in subsection (b)) made—

10 (A) on March 9, 1990 (Entry No. 110-
11 0675952-3),

1 (B) on September 19, 1990 (Entry No.
2 110-1525996-0),

3 (C) on November 7, 1990 (Entry No. 110-
4 3667810-7), and

5 (D) on December 21, 1990 (Entry No.
6 110-1526938-1), and

7 (2) refund any duties paid with respect to such
8 entry, if certification is given that such entry will be
9 reexported or destroyed within eight years of entry
10 and such certification is submitted to the appro-
11 priate customs officer within sixty days after the
12 date of the enactment of this Act.

13 (b) PARTIALLY ASSEMBLED LEAD FUEL ASSEM-
14 BLY.—A partially assembled lead fuel assembly is de-
15 scribed in this subsection if it consists of not more than
16 4 partially assembled fuel bundles, composed of nuclear
17 fuel rods of zircaloy tubes filled with slightly enriched ura-
18 nium dioxide (UO₂) pellets, arranged into bundles of 96
19 rods, including a channel and upper handles and lower tie
20 plates.
