Mr. MURPHY introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means

A BILL

To prevent States from reducing unemployment compensation benefits by certain remuneration for services in the military reserves.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. UNEMPLOYMENT COMPENSATION NOT TO BE**
4 **REDUCED BY CERTAIN AMOUNTS OF COM-**
5 **PENSATION FOR SERVICES IN MILITARY RE-**
6 **SERVES.**

7 (a) IN GENERAL.—Subsection (a) of section 3304 of
8 the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (relating to approval
9 of State laws) is amended by redesignating paragraph
10 (18) as paragraph (19), by striking “and” at the end of

1 paragraph (17), and by inserting after paragraph (17) the
2 following new paragraph:

3 “(18) except as provided in paragraph (15),
4 compensation shall not be denied or reduced by rea-
5 son of remuneration paid for services performed as
6 a member of a reserve component (as defined in sec-
7 tion 101(24) of title 37, United States Code) to the
8 extent such remuneration paid during any calendar
9 month does not exceed \$300; and”.

10 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—

11 (1) IN GENERAL.—The amendment made by
12 subsection (a) shall take effect on January 1, 1994.

13 (2) SPECIAL RULE.—In the case of any State
14 the legislature of which has not been in session for
15 at least 30 calendar days (whether or not successive)
16 between the date of the enactment of this Act and
17 January 1, 1994, the amendment made by sub-
18 section (a) shall take effect 30 calendar days after
19 the 1st day on which such legislature is in session
20 on or after January 1, 1994.

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
