A BILL

To amend the Immigration and Nationality Act to provide for the exclusion of immigrants infected with the HIV virus.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. EXCLUSION OF IMMIGRANTS INFECTED WITH**
4 **THE HIV VIRUS.**

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 212(a)(1)(A)(i) of the Im-
6 migration and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C.
7 1182(a)(1)(A)(i)), as amended by section 601(a) of the
8 Immigration Act of 1990, is amended by inserting “or,
9 in the case of an alien who is an immigrant, to be infected

1 with the human immunodeficiency virus” after “to have
2 a communicable disease of public health significance”.

3 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by
4 subsection (a) shall apply to individuals seeking admission
5 as immigrants on or after January 1, 1993, or, if later,
6 the date of the enactment of this Act.
