Mr. STEARNS submitted the following resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Rules

# RESOLUTION

Providing for the consideration of the joint resolution (H.J. Res. 22) proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United States relating to voluntary prayer in the schools.

1       *Resolved*, That immediately upon the adoption of this  
2 resolution the House shall resolve itself into the Commit-  
3 tee of the Whole House on the State of the Union for the  
4 consideration of the joint resolution (H.J. Res. 22) pro-  
5 posing an amendment to the Constitution of the United  
6 States relating to voluntary prayer in public schools, and  
7 the first reading of the resolution shall be dispensed with.  
8 After general debate which shall be confined to the joint

1 resolution and which shall not exceed two hours to be con-  
2 trolled by Representative Duncan of Tennessee, the joint  
3 resolution shall be considered for amendment under the  
4 five-minute rule. At the conclusion of the consideration of  
5 the joint resolution for amendment the Committee shall  
6 rise and report the joint resolution to the House with such  
7 amendments as may have been adopted, and the previous  
8 question shall be considered as ordered on the joint resolu-  
9 tion and amendments thereto to final passage without in-  
10 tervening motion except one motion to recommit.
