Providing for the consideration of the bill (H.R. 20) to amend title 5, United States Code, to restore to Federal civilian employees their right to participate voluntarily, as private citizens, in the political processes of the Nation, to protect such employees from improper political solicitations, and for other purposes.

Mr. DERRICK, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

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1 *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 1(b) of
3 rule XXIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee

1 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-
2 ation of the bill (H.R. 20) to amend title 5, United States
3 Code, to restore to Federal civilian employees their right
4 to participate voluntarily, as private citizens, in the politi-
5 cal processes of the Nation, to protect such employees
6 from improper political solicitations, and for other pur-
7 poses. The first reading of the bill shall be dispensed with.
8 All points of order against the bill and against its consid-
9 eration are waived. General debate shall be confined to
10 the bill and shall not exceed one hour equally divided and
11 controlled by the chairman and ranking minority member
12 of the Committee on Post Office and Civil Service. After
13 general debate the bill shall be considered for amendment
14 under the five-minute rule and shall be considered as read.
15 No amendment shall be in order except those printed in
16 the report of the Committee on Rules accompanying this
17 resolution. Each amendment may be offered only in the
18 order printed and by the named proponent, shall be con-
19 sidered as read, shall be debatable for the time specified
20 in the report equally divided and controlled by the pro-
21 ponent and an opponent, shall not be subject to amend-
22 ment except as specified in the report, and shall not be
23 subject to a demand for division of the question in the
24 House or in the Committee of the Whole. At the conclu-
25 sion of consideration of the bill for amendment the Com-

1 mittee shall rise and report the bill to the House with such
2 amendments as may have been adopted. The previous
3 question shall be considered as ordered on the bill and
4 amendments thereto to final passage without intervening
5 motion except one motion to recommit.
