Ms. SLAUGHTER from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for the consideration of the bill (H.R. 4) to amend the Public Health Service Act to revise and extend the programs of the National Institutes of Health, and for other purposes.

1 *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 1(b) of
3 rule XXIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee
4 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-
5 ation of the bill (H.R. 4) to amend the Public Health Serv-
6 ice Act to revise and extend the programs of the National

1 Institutes of Health, and for other purposes. The first
2 reading of the bill shall be dispensed with. Points of order
3 against consideration of the bill for failure to comply with
4 clause 2(l)(6) of rule XI are waived. General debate shall
5 be confined to the bill and shall not exceed one hour equal-
6 ly divided and controlled by the chairman and ranking mi-
7 nority member of the Committee on Energy and Com-
8 merce. After general debate the bill shall be considered
9 for amendment under the five-minute rule. It shall be in
10 order to consider as an original bill for the purpose of
11 amendment under the five-minute rule the amendment in
12 the nature of a substitute recommended by the Committee
13 on Energy and Commerce now printed in the bill. The
14 committee amendment in the nature of a substitute shall
15 be considered as read. No amendment to the committee
16 amendment in the nature of a substitute shall be in order
17 except those printed in the report of the Committee on
18 Rules accompanying this resolution. Each amendment
19 may be offered only in the order printed and by the named
20 proponent or a designee, shall be considered as read, shall
21 be debatable for the time specified in the report equally
22 divided and controlled by the proponent and an opponent,
23 shall not be subject to amendment except as specified in
24 the report, and shall not be subject a to demand for divi-
25 sion of the question in the House or in the Committee

1 of the Whole. At the conclusion of consideration of the
2 bill for amendment the Committee shall rise and report
3 the bill to the House with such amendments as may have
4 been adopted. Any Member may demand a separate vote
5 in the House on any amendment adopted in the Commit-
6 tee of the Whole to the bill or to the committee amend-
7 ment in the nature of a substitute. The previous question
8 shall be considered as ordered on the bill and amendments
9 thereto to final passage without intervening motion except
10 one motion to recommit with or without instructions. After
11 passage of H.R. 4, it shall be in order to take from the
12 Speaker's table the bill S. 1 and to consider the Senate
13 bill in the House. It shall then be in order to move to
14 strike all after the enacting clause of the Senate bill and
15 to insert in lieu thereof the provisions of H.R. 4 as passed
16 by the House. If the motion is adopted and the Senate
17 bill, as amended, is passed, then it shall be in order to
18 move that the House insist on its amendment to S. 1 and
19 request a conference with the Senate thereon.
