Mr. BEILENSON, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for the consideration of the concurrent resolution (H. Con. Res. 64) setting forth the congressional budget for the United States Government for the fiscal years 1994, 1995, 1996, 1997, and 1998.

1 *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 1(b) of
3 rule XXIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee
4 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-
5 ation of the concurrent resolution (H. Con. Res. 64) set-

1 ting forth the congressional budget for the United States
2 Government for the fiscal years 1994, 1995, 1996, 1997,
3 and 1998. The first reading of the concurrent resolution
4 shall be dispensed with. All points of order against the
5 concurrent resolution and against its consideration are
6 waived. General debate shall be confined to the congres-
7 sional budget and shall not exceed ten hours, with seven
8 hours (including four hours on the subject of economic
9 goals and policies) equally divided and controlled by the
10 chairman and ranking minority member of the Committee
11 on the Budget, two hours controlled by Representative
12 Mfume of Maryland, and one hour controlled by Rep-
13 resentative Solomon of New York. After general debate
14 the Committee of the Whole shall rise without motion. No
15 further consideration of the concurrent resolution shall be
16 in order except pursuant to a subsequent order of the
17 House.
