## RESOLUTION

Providing for the further consideration of the concurrent resolution (H. Con. Res. 64) setting forth the congressional budget for the United States Government for the fiscal years 1994, 1995, 1996, 1997, and 1998.

1       *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this  
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 1(b) of  
3 rule XXIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee  
4 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for further  
5 consideration of the concurrent resolution (H. Con. Res.  
6 64) setting forth the congressional budget for the United

1 States Government for the fiscal years 1994, 1995, 1996,  
2 1997, and 1998. The concurrent resolution shall be con-  
3 sidered as read for amendment under the five-minute rule.  
4 No amendment shall be in order except those printed in  
5 the report of the Committee on Rules accompanying this  
6 resolution. Each amendment may be offered only in the  
7 order printed and by the named proponent or a designee,  
8 shall be considered as read, shall be debatable for the time  
9 specified in the report equally divided and controlled by  
10 the proponent and an opponent, and shall not be subject  
11 to amendment except as specified in this resolution. All  
12 points of order against the amendments printed in the re-  
13 port are waived. If more than one amendment in the na-  
14 ture of a substitute is adopted, only the last to be adopted  
15 shall be considered as finally adopted and reported to the  
16 House. After the conclusion of consideration of the concur-  
17 rent resolution for amendment and a final period of gen-  
18 eral debate, which shall not exceed twenty minutes equally  
19 divided and controlled by the chairman and ranking mi-  
20 nority member of the Committee on the Budget, the Com-  
21 mittee shall rise and report the concurrent resolution to  
22 the House with such amendment as may have been finally  
23 adopted. The previous question shall be considered as or-  
24 dered on the concurrent resolution and amendments there-  
25 to to final adoption without intervening motion except

1 amendments offered by the chairman of the Committee  
2 on the Budget pursuant to section 305(a)(5) of the Con-  
3 gressional Budget Act of 1974 to achieve mathematical  
4 consistency. The concurrent resolution shall not be subject  
5 to a demand for division of the question of its adoption.
