Mr. HALL, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 820) to amend the Stevenson-Wydler Technology Innovation Act of 1980 to enhance manufacturing technology development and transfer, to authorize appropriations for the Technology Administration of the Department of Commerce, including the National Institute of Standards and Technology, and for other purposes.

1 *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 1(b) of

1 rule XXIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee
2 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-
3 ation of the bill (H.R. 820) to amend the Stevenson-
4 Wydler Technology Innovation Act of 1980 to enhance
5 manufacturing technology development and transfer, to
6 authorize appropriations for the Technology Administra-
7 tion of the Department of Commerce, including the Na-
8 tional Institute of Standards and Technology, and for
9 other purposes. The first reading of the bill shall be dis-
10 pensed with. All points of order against consideration of
11 the bill for failure to comply with clause 2(l)(6) of rule
12 XI are waived. General debate shall be confined to the bill
13 and shall not exceed one hour equally divided and con-
14 trolled by the chairman and ranking minority member of
15 the Committee on Science, Space, and Technology. After
16 general debate the bill shall be considered for amendment
17 under the five-minute rule. It shall be in order to consider
18 as an original bill for the purpose of amendment under
19 the five-minute rule the amendment in the nature of a sub-
20 stitute recommended by the Committee on Science, Space,
21 and Technology now printed in the bill, modified by the
22 amendment printed in section 2 of this resolution. The
23 committee amendment in the nature of a substitute, as
24 modified, shall be considered by title rather than by sec-
25 tion. Each title shall be considered as read. Points of order

1 against the committee amendment in the nature of a sub-
2 stitute, as modified, for failure to comply with clause 5(a)
3 of rule XXI are waived. At the conclusion of consideration
4 of the bill for amendment, the Committee shall rise and
5 report the bill to the House with such amendments as may
6 have been adopted. Any Member may demand a separate
7 vote in the House on any amendment adopted in the Com-
8 mittee of the Whole to the bill or to the committee amend-
9 ment in the nature of a substitute, as modified. The pre-
10 vious question shall be considered as ordered on the bill
11 and amendments thereto to final passage without inter-
12 vening motion except one motion to recommit with or
13 without instructions.

14 SEC. 2. The amendment in the nature of a substitute
15 recommended by the Committee on Science, Space, and
16 Technology now printed in the bill is modified by striking
17 section 506.
