Mr. MANTON submitted the following resolution; which was referred to the Committee on House Administration

RESOLUTION

Adjusting the status of an existing position on the Capitol Police for duty with respect to the House of Representatives.

1 *Resolved*, That there is established one additional po-
2 sition of lieutenant on the Capitol Police for duty with re-
3 spect to the House of Representatives, to serve as agency
4 training representative for the Capitol Police. Each ap-
5 pointment to the position shall be made—

6 (1) by the Capitol Police Board from among
7 members and officers of the Capitol Police, with
8 prior approval of the Committee on House Adminis-
9 tration; and

1 (2) without regard to political affiliation and
2 solely on the basis of fitness to perform the duties
3 of the position.

4 SEC. 2. (a)(1) The position of agency training rep-
5 resentative, as established by the first section of House
6 Resolution 320, is abolished.

7 (2) The former position of an officer or member serv-
8 ing as agency training representative, as referred to in sec-
9 tion 2 of House Resolution 320, is abolished.

10 (b) The resolution referred to in subsection (a) is
11 House Resolution 320, Ninety-ninth Congress, agreed to
12 November 14, 1985, as enacted into permanent law by
13 section 102 of the Legislative Branch Appropriations Act,
14 1987 (as incorporated by reference in section 101(j) of
15 Public Law 99-500 and section 101(j) of Public Law 99-
16 591 (40 U.S.C. 206 note)).

17 SEC. 3. Until otherwise provided by law, there shall
18 be paid out of the contingent fund of the House such sums
19 as may be necessary to carry out this resolution.
