Mr. MOAKLEY, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for the consideration of the bill (H.R. 1159) to revise, clarify, and improve certain marine safety laws of the United States, and for other purposes.

1 *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 1(b) of
3 rule XXIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee
4 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-
5 ation of the bill (H.R. 1159) to revise, clarify, and improve
6 certain marine safety laws of the United States, and for
7 other purposes. The first reading of the bill shall be dis-

1 pensed with. General debate shall be confined to the bill
2 and shall not exceed one hour equally divided and con-
3 trolled by the chairman and ranking minority member of
4 the Committee on Merchant Marine and Fisheries. After
5 general debate the bill shall be considered for amendment
6 under the five-minute rule. It shall be in order to consider
7 as an original bill for the purpose of amendment under
8 the five-minute rule the amendment in the nature of a sub-
9 stitute recommended by the Committee on Merchant Ma-
10 rine and Fisheries now printed in the bill. Each section
11 of the committee amendment in the nature of a substitute
12 shall be considered as read. At the conclusion of consider-
13 ation of the bill for amendment the Committee shall rise
14 and report the bill to the House with such amendments
15 as may have been adopted. Any Member may demand a
16 separate vote in the House on any amendment adopted
17 in the Committee of the Whole to the bill or to the commit-
18 tee amendment in the nature of a substitute. The previous
19 question shall be considered as ordered on the bill and
20 amendments thereto to final passage without intervening
21 motion except one motion to recommit with or without in-
22 structions.
