RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 1876) to provide authority for the President to enter into trade agreements to conclude the Uruguay Round of multilateral trade negotiations under the auspices of the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade, to extend tariff proclamation authority to carry out such agreements, and to apply congressional “fast track” procedures to a bill implementing such agreements.

1 *Resolved*, That upon the adoption of this resolution
2 it shall be in order to consider in the House the bill (H.R.
3 1876) to provide authority for the President to enter into
4 trade agreements to conclude the Uruguay Round of mul-
5 tilateral trade negotiations under the auspices of the Gen-
6 eral Agreement on Tariffs and Trade, to extend tariff
7 proclamation authority to carry out such agreements, and
8 to apply congressional “fast track” procedures to a bill
9 implementing such agreements. Debate on the bill shall
10 not exceed one hour, with thirty minutes equally divided
11 and controlled by the chairman and ranking minority
12 member of the Committee on Ways and Means and thirty
13 minutes equally divided and controlled by the chairman
14 and ranking minority member of the Committee on Rules.
15 The previous question shall be considered as ordered on
16 the bill to final passage without intervening motion except
17 one motion to recommit.
