## RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 2530) to amend the Federal Land Policy and Management Act of 1976 to authorize appropriations for programs, functions, and activities of the Bureau of Land Management, Department of the Interior, for fiscal year 1994, and for other purposes.

- 1       *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this
- 2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 1(b) of
- 3 rule XXIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee

1 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-  
2 ation of the bill (H.R. 2530) to amend the Federal Land  
3 Policy and Management Act of 1976 to authorize appro-  
4 priations for programs, functions, and activities of the Bu-  
5 reau of Land Management, Department of the Interior,  
6 for fiscal year 1994, and for other purposes. The first  
7 reading of the bill shall be dispensed with. General debate  
8 shall be confined to the bill and shall not exceed one hour  
9 equally divided and controlled by the chairman and rank-  
10 ing minority member of the Committee on Natural Re-  
11 sources. After general debate the bill shall be considered  
12 for amendment under the five-minute rule. Each section  
13 shall be considered as read. Points of order against the  
14 amendments recommended by the Committee on Natural  
15 Resources now printed in the bill for failure to comply with  
16 clause 7 of rule XVI are waived. All points of order against  
17 the amendment printed in the report of the Committee  
18 on Rules accompanying this resolution are waived. At the  
19 conclusion of consideration of the bill for amendment the  
20 Committee shall rise and report the bill to the House with  
21 such amendments as may have been adopted. The previous  
22 question shall be considered as ordered on the bill and  
23 amendments thereto to final passage without intervening  
24 motion except one motion to recommit.
