Mr. BEILENSON, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

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## RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 2330) to authorize appropriations for fiscal year 1994 for intelligence and intelligence-related activities of the United States Government and the Central Intelligence Agency Retirement and Disability System, and for other purposes.

1       *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this  
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 1(b) of  
3 rule XXIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee  
4 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-  
5 ation of the bill (H.R. 2330) to authorize appropriations

1 for fiscal year 1994 for intelligence and intelligence-relat-  
2 ed activities of the United States Government and the  
3 Central Intelligence Agency Retirement and Disability  
4 System, and for other purposes. The first reading of the  
5 bill shall be dispensed with. Points of order against consid-  
6 eration of the bill for failure to comply with section 302(f)  
7 or 303(a) of the Congressional Budget Act of 1974 are  
8 waived. General debate shall be confined to the bill and  
9 shall not exceed one hour equally divided and controlled  
10 by the chairman and ranking minority member of the Per-  
11 manent Select Committee on Intelligence. After general  
12 debate the bill shall be considered for amendment under  
13 the five-minute rule. It shall be in order to consider as  
14 an original bill for the purpose of amendment under the  
15 five-minute rule the amendment in the nature of a sub-  
16 stitute recommended by the Permanent Select Committee  
17 on Intelligence now printed in the bill. The committee  
18 amendment in the nature of a substitute shall be consid-  
19 ered by title rather than by section. Each title shall be  
20 considered as read. Points of order against the committee  
21 amendment in the nature of a substitute for failure to  
22 comply with clause 7 of rule XVI or section 302(f) or  
23 303(a) of the Congressional Budget Act of 1974 are  
24 waived. No amendment to the committee amendment in  
25 the nature of a substitute shall be in order unless printed

1 in the portion of the Congressional Record designated for  
2 that purpose in clause 6 of rule XXIII prior to its consid-  
3 eration. At the conclusion of consideration of the bill for  
4 amendment the Committee shall rise and report the bill  
5 to the House with such amendments as may have been  
6 adopted. Any Member may demand a separate vote in the  
7 House on any amendment adopted in the Committee of  
8 the Whole to the bill or to the committee amendment in  
9 the nature of a substitute. The previous question shall be  
10 considered as ordered on the bill and amendments thereto  
11 to final passage without intervening motion except one  
12 motion to recommit with or without instructions.
