Mr. FROST, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for further consideration of the bill (H.R. 2401) to authorize appropriations for fiscal year 1994 for military activities of the Department of Defense, to prescribe military personnel strengths for fiscal year 1994, and for other purposes.

1 *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 1(b) of
3 rule XXIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee
4 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for further
5 consideration of the bill (H.R. 2401) to authorize appro-

1 priations for fiscal year 1994 for military activities of the
2 Department of Defense, to prescribe military personnel
3 strengths for fiscal year 1994, and for other purposes.
4 After further general debate, which shall be confined to
5 the bill and the amendments made in order by this resolu-
6 tion and shall not exceed one hour equally divided and con-
7 trolled by the chairman and ranking minority member of
8 the Committee on Armed Services, the bill shall be consid-
9 ered for amendment under the five-minute rule. It shall
10 be in order to consider as an original bill for the purpose
11 of amendment under the five-minute rule the amendment
12 in the nature of a substitute recommended by the Commit-
13 tee on Armed Services now printed in the bill. The com-
14 mittee amendment in the nature of a substitute shall be
15 considered as read. All points of order against the commit-
16 tee amendment in the nature of a substitute are waived.
17 No amendment to the committee amendment in the nature
18 of a substitute shall be in order except those printed in
19 the report of the Committee on Rules accompanying this
20 resolution or specified by a subsequent order of the House.
21 Except as specified in section 2 of this resolution, the
22 amendments printed in the report shall be considered in
23 the order printed. Unless otherwise specified in the report,
24 each amendment may be offered only by the named pro-
25 ponent or a designee, shall be considered as read, shall

1 be debatable for the time specified in the report equally
2 divided and controlled by the proponent and an opponent,
3 shall not be subject to amendment, and shall not be sub-
4 ject to a demand for division of the question in the House
5 or in the Committee of the Whole. All points of order
6 against amendments printed in the report are waived.

7 SEC. 2. The chairman of the Committee of the Whole
8 may postpone until a time during further consideration
9 in the Committee of the Whole a request for a recorded
10 vote on any amendment made in order by this resolution.
11 The chairman of the Committee of the Whole may reduce
12 to not less than five minutes the time for voting by elec-
13 tronic device on any postponed question that immediately
14 follows another vote by electronic device without interven-
15 ing business: *Provided*, That the time for voting by elec-
16 tronic device on the first in any series of questions shall
17 be not less than fifteen minutes. The chairman of the
18 Committee of the Whole may recognize for consideration
19 of amendments printed within a numbered part of the re-
20 port of the Committee on Rules (other than part 1) out
21 of the order in which they are printed, but not sooner than
22 one hour after the chairman of the Committee on Armed
23 Services or a designee announces from the floor a request
24 to that effect.

1 SEC. 3. (a) After designation of the committee
2 amendment in the nature of a substitute, an additional
3 period of general debate shall be confined to funding levels
4 for ballistic missile defense and shall not exceed forty min-
5 utes equally divided and controlled by the chairman and
6 ranking minority member of the Committee on Armed
7 Services. It shall then be in order to consider the amend-
8 ments printed in part 1 of the report of the Committee
9 on Rules. If more than one of the amendments printed
10 in part 1 of the report is adopted, only the last to be
11 adopted shall be considered as finally adopted and re-
12 ported to the House.

13 (b) After disposition of or postponement of further
14 proceedings on the amendments printed in part 1 of the
15 report, an additional period of general debate shall be con-
16 fined to the Trident II (D-5) missile and shall not exceed
17 thirty minutes equally divided and controlled by the chair-
18 man and ranking minority member of the Committee on
19 Armed Services. It shall then be in order to consider the
20 amendments printed in part 2 of the report.

21 (c) After disposition of or postponement of further
22 proceedings on the amendments printed in part 2 of the
23 report, an additional period of general debate shall be con-
24 fined to burdensharing and shall not exceed twenty min-
25 utes equally divided and controlled by the chairman and

1 ranking minority member of the Committee on Armed
2 Services. It shall then be in order to consider the amend-
3 ments printed in part 3 of the report.

4 (d) After disposition of or postponement of further
5 proceedings on the amendments printed in part 3 of the
6 report, an additional period of general debate shall be con-
7 fined to economic conversion and shall not exceed thirty
8 minutes equally divided and controlled by the chairman
9 and ranking minority member of the Committee on Armed
10 Services. It shall then be in order to consider the amend-
11 ments printed in part 4 of the report.

12 SEC. 4. After disposition of the amendments printed
13 in part 4 of the report of the Committee on Rules and
14 any other amendment on which further proceedings were
15 earlier postponed, the Committee shall rise without mo-
16 tion. No further consideration of the bill shall be in order
17 except pursuant to a subsequent order of the House.
