5 for other purposes, with a Senate amendment thereto, and
6 to concur in the Senate amendment. The Senate amend-
7 ment shall be considered as read. The motion shall be de-
8 batable for one hour equally divided and controlled by the
9 chairman and ranking minority member of the Committee
10 on Post Office and Civil Service. The previous question
11 shall be considered as ordered on the motion to final adop-
12 tion without intervening motion.
