Mr. McCOLLUM submitted the following resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Rules

RESOLUTION

Providing for the consideration of the joint resolution (H.J. Res. 38) proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United States with respect to the number of terms of office of Members of the Senate and the House of Representatives.

1 *Resolved*, That immediately after the adoption of this
2 resolution the House shall resolve itself into the Commit-
3 tee of the Whole House on the state of the Union for the
4 consideration of the joint resolution (H.J. Res. 38) pro-
5 posing an amendment to the Constitution of the United
6 States with respect to the number of terms of office of
7 Members of the Senate and the House of Representatives,

1 and the first reading of the joint resolution shall be dis-
2 pensed with. After general debate which shall be confined
3 to the joint resolution and which shall not exceed six hours
4 to be equally divided and controlled by Representative
5 McCollum of Florida, or a designee, and a Member op-
6 posed thereto, the joint resolution shall be considered for
7 amendment under the five-minute rule. At the conclusion
8 of the consideration of the joint resolution for amendment
9 the Committee shall rise and report the joint resolution
10 to the House with such amendments as may have been
11 adopted, and the previous question shall be considered as
12 ordered on the joint resolution and amendments thereto
13 to final passage without intervening motion except one
14 motion to recommit.
