Mr. HALL of Ohio, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 1845) to establish the Biological Survey in the Department of the Interior.

1 *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 1(b) of
3 rule XXIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee
4 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-
5 ation of the bill (H.R. 1845) to establish the Biological
6 Survey in the Department of the Interior. The first read-
7 ing of the bill shall be dispensed with. Points of order

1 against consideration of the bill for failure to comply with
2 section 302(f), 308(a), or 401(b) of the Congressional
3 Budget Act of 1974 are waived. General debate shall be
4 confined to the bill and shall not exceed one hour, with
5 thirty minutes equally divided and controlled by the chair-
6 man and ranking minority member of the Committee on
7 Merchant Marine and Fisheries, thirty minutes equally di-
8 vided and controlled by the chairman and ranking minor-
9 ity member of the Committee on Natural Resources, and
10 fifteen minutes equally divided and controlled by the chair-
11 man and ranking minority member of the Committee on
12 Science, Space, and Technology. After general debate the
13 bill shall be considered for amendment under the five-
14 minute rule. In lieu of the committee amendments now
15 printed in the bill, it shall be in order to consider as an
16 original bill for the purpose of amendment under the five-
17 minute rule the amendment in the nature of a substitute
18 printed in the report of the Committee on Rules accom-
19 panying this resolution. Each section of the amendment
20 in the nature of a substitute shall be considered as read.
21 Points of order against the amendment in the nature of
22 a substitute for failure to comply with clause 5(a) of rule
23 XXI are waived. At the conclusion of consideration of the
24 bill for amendment the Committee shall rise and report
25 the bill to the House with such amendments as may have

1 been adopted. Any Member may demand a separate vote
2 in the House on any amendment adopted in the Commit-
3 tee of the Whole to the bill or to the amendment in the
4 nature of a substitute made in order as original text. The
5 previous question shall be considered as ordered on the
6 bill and amendments thereto to final passage without in-
7 tervening motion except one motion to recommit with or
8 without instructions.
