Mr. BONIOR, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 3167) to extend the emergency unemployment compensation program, to establish a system of worker profiling, and for other purposes.

1 *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 1(b) of
3 rule XXIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee
4 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-
5 ation of the bill (H.R. 3167) to extend the emergency un-
6 employment compensation program, to establish a system

1 of worker profiling, and for other purposes. The first read-
2 ing of the bill shall be dispensed with. All points of order
3 against consideration of the bill are waived. General de-
4 bate shall be confined to the bill and shall not exceed one
5 hour equally divided and controlled by the chairman and
6 ranking minority member of the Committee on Ways and
7 Means. After general debate the bill shall be considered
8 for amendment under the five-minute rule. In lieu of the
9 amendments recommended by the Committee on Ways
10 and Means now printed in the bill, it shall be in order
11 to consider as an original bill for the purpose of amend-
12 ment under the five-minute rule an amendment in the na-
13 ture of a substitute consisting of the bill, modified by the
14 amendments recommended by the Committee on Ways
15 and Means now printed in the bill. The amendment in the
16 nature of a substitute shall be considered as read. All
17 points of order against the amendment in the nature of
18 a substitute are waived. No amendment to the amendment
19 in the nature of a substitute shall be in order except those
20 printed in the report of the Committee on Rules accom-
21 panying this resolution. Each amendment may be offered
22 only in the order printed in the report, may be offered
23 only by a Member designated in the report, shall be con-
24 sidered as read, shall be debatable for the time specified
25 in the report equally divided and controlled by the pro-

1 ponent and an opponent, and shall not be subject to
2 amendment. All points of order against the amendments
3 printed in the report are waived. At the conclusion of con-
4 sideration of the bill for amendment the Committee shall
5 rise and report the bill to the House with such amend-
6 ments as may have been adopted. Any Member may de-
7 mand a separate vote in the House on any amendment
8 adopted in the Committee of the Whole to the bill or to
9 the amendment in the nature of a substitute made in order
10 as original text. The previous question shall be considered
11 as ordered on the bill and amendments thereto to final
12 passage without intervening motion except one motion to
13 recommit with or without instructions.
