RESOLUTION

Requiring the appropriate committees of the House to report legislation to transfer certain functions of the Government Printing Office, and for other purposes.

1 *Resolved,*

2 **SECTION 1. REQUIREMENT FOR THE REPORTING OF LEGIS-**
3 **LATION.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than October 1, 1994,
5 the appropriate committees of the House of Representa-
6 tives shall report to the House legislation to accomplish
7 the purposes specified in subsection (b).

1 (b) PURPOSES SPECIFIED.—The purposes referred to
2 in subsection (a) are—

3 (1) transfer of executive branch printing from
4 the Government Printing Office to the General Serv-
5 ices Administration;

6 (2) transfer of the functions now carried out by
7 the Superintendent of Documents to the Librarian
8 of Congress, who shall be responsible for the dis-
9 semination of all Government information, with the
10 on-line networks of the Library of Congress to be
11 used for Government information not requiring a
12 printed format;

13 (3) abolition of the Joint Committee on Print-
14 ing and the Joint Committee on the Library and es-
15 tablishment of a Joint Committee on Information;

16 (4) reduction of the in-house printing capacity
17 of the Government Printing Office to the minimum
18 level necessary;

19 (5) procurement of other congressional printing
20 whenever possible from the private sector through a
21 competitive bid process, with the procurement to be
22 administered by the Public Printer;

23 (6) reduction in the work force at the Govern-
24 ment Printing Office to 500 positions, with the re-
25 duction to be accomplished gradually, but not later

1 than the end of the second fiscal year after the fiscal
2 year in which this resolution is agreed to;

3 (7) submission to the Congress by the Public
4 Printer of an annual report on the standards appli-
5 cable to, and the efficiency of, the Government
6 Printing Office; and

7 (8) submission to the Congress of triennial
8 General Accounting Office audits of the functions of
9 the Government Printing Office.
