Mr. BONIOR, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

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## RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 3167) to extend the emergency unemployment compensation program, to establish a system of worker profiling, and for other purposes.

1       *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this  
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 1(b) of  
3 rule XXIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee  
4 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-  
5 ation of the bill (H.R. 3167) to extend the emergency un-  
6 employment compensation program, to establish a system

1 of worker profiling, and for other purposes. The first read-  
2 ing of the bill shall be dispensed with. All points of order  
3 against consideration of the bill are waived. General de-  
4 bate shall be confined to the bill and the amendments  
5 made in order by this resolution and shall not exceed one  
6 hour equally divided and controlled by the chairman and  
7 ranking minority member of the Committee on Ways and  
8 Means. After general debate the bill shall be considered  
9 for amendment under the five-minute rule. In lieu of the  
10 amendments recommended by the Committee on Ways  
11 and Means now printed in the bill, the amendments print-  
12 ed in part 1 of the report of the Committee on Rules ac-  
13 companying this resolution shall be considered as adopted  
14 in the House and in the Committee of the Whole. The  
15 bill as so amended shall be considered as read. All points  
16 of order against the bill, as so amended, are waived. No  
17 further amendment shall be in order except those printed  
18 in part 2 of the report. Each amendment may be offered  
19 only in the order printed in the report, may be offered  
20 only by a Member designated in the report, shall be con-  
21 sidered as read, shall be debatable for the time specified  
22 in the report equally divided and controlled by the pro-  
23 ponent and an opponent, and shall not be subject to  
24 amendment. All points of order against the amendments  
25 printed in the report are waived. At the conclusion of con-

1 sideration of the bill for amendment the Committee shall  
2 rise and report the bill to the House with such amend-  
3 ments as may have been adopted. The previous question  
4 shall be considered as ordered on the bill and amendments  
5 thereto to final passage without intervening motion except  
6 one motion to recommit with or without instructions.

7       SEC. 2. House Resolution 265 is laid on the table.
