Ms. SLAUGHTER, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

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- 1 *Resolved*, That upon adoption of this resolution it
- 2 shall be in order to consider the conference report and
- 3 amendments reported from conference in disagreement on

1 the bill (H.R. 2491) making appropriations for the De-
2 partments of Veterans Affairs and Housing and Urban
3 Development, and for sundry independent agencies,
4 boards, commissions, corporations, and offices for the fis-
5 cal year ending September 30, 1994, and for other pur-
6 poses. All points of order against the conference report
7 are waived. The conference report, amendments in dis-
8 agreement, and motions printed in the joint explanatory
9 statement of the committee of conference to dispose of
10 amendments in disagreement shall be considered as read.
11 It shall be in order, any rule of the House to the contrary
12 notwithstanding, to consider a motion offered by Rep-
13 resentative Stokes of Ohio or a designee that the House
14 recede from its disagreement to the amendment of the
15 Senate numbered 113 and concur therein with the amend-
16 ment printed in section 2 of this resolution. That motion
17 shall be debatable for one hour equally divided and con-
18 trolled by the proponent and an opponent. The previous
19 question shall be considered as ordered on that motion to
20 final adoption without intervening motion.

21 SEC. 2. The amendment of the House to the amend-
22 ment of the Senate numbered 113 is as follows:

23 In lieu of the matter proposed by said amendment,
24 insert: “: *Provided further*, That, pursuant to Public Law
25 102-486, an amount equal to not more than 50 percent

1 of all utility energy efficiency and water conservation cash
2 rebates received by the National Aeronautics and Space
3 Administration may be made available for additional en-
4 ergy efficiency and water conservation measures, including
5 facility surveys: *Provided further*, That none of the funds
6 provided in this Act to the National Aeronautics and
7 Space Administration shall be available for other than ter-
8 mination costs of the advanced solid rocket motor pro-
9 gram.

10 “Notwithstanding any other provision of this Act, the
11 amounts appropriated in this Act for fiscal year 1994 shall
12 be: \$4,853,500,000 for the National Aeronautics and
13 Space Administration ‘Space flight, control and data com-
14 munications’, \$517,700,000 for the National Aeronautics
15 and Space Administration ‘Construction of facilities’,
16 \$7,529,300,000 for the National Aeronautics and Space
17 Administration ‘Research and development’,
18 \$1,480,853,000 for the Environmental Protection Agency
19 ‘Hazardous substance superfund’, \$1,998,500,000 for the
20 National Science Foundation ‘Research and related activi-
21 ties’, and \$110,000,000 for the National Science Founda-
22 tion ‘Academic research infrastructure’ ”.
