2 ments reported from conference in disagreement on the
3 bill (H.R. 2520) making appropriations for the Depart-
4 ment of the Interior and related agencies for the fiscal
5 year ending September 30, 1994, and for other purposes,

1 motions printed in the joint explanatory statement of the
2 committee of conference to dispose of amendments in dis-
3 agreement, and the motion printed in section 2 of this res-
4 olution, shall be considered as read. Points of order under
5 clause 7 of rule XVI against the motions printed in the
6 joint explanatory statement of the committee of conference
7 to dispose of the amendments of the Senate numbered 10,
8 24, 81, 102, 123, and 125, and the motion printed in sec-
9 tion 2 of this resolution to dispose of the amendment of
10 the Senate numbered 18, are waived.

11 SEC. 2. The motion to dispose of the amendment of
12 the Senate numbered 18 is as follows:

13 “Mr. Yates moves that the House recede from its dis-
14 agreement to the amendment of the Senate numbered 18,
15 and concur therein with an amendment, as follows:

16 “In lieu of the matter proposed by said amendment,
17 insert ‘: *Provided*, That none of the funds under this head
18 shall be used to conduct new surveys on private property
19 unless specifically authorized in writing by the property
20 owner’.”.
