Mr. McCOLLUM submitted the following resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Rules

RESOLUTION

Providing for the consideration of the bill (H.R. 2872) to prevent and punish crime, to strengthen the rights of crime victims, to assist State and local efforts against crime, and for other purposes.

1 *Resolved*, That immediately after the adoption of this
2 resolution the House shall resolve itself into the Commit-
3 tee of the Whole House on the state of the Union for the
4 consideration of the bill (H.R. 2872) to prevent and pun-
5 ish crime, to strengthen the rights of crime victims, to as-
6 sist State and local efforts against crime, and for other
7 purposes, the first reading of the bill shall be dispensed
8 with, and all points of order against the bill and against

1 its consideration are hereby waived. After general debate
2 which shall be confined to the bill, and which shall not
3 exceed three hours equally divided and controlled by the
4 chairman and ranking minority member of the Committee
5 on the Judiciary, the bill shall be considered for amend-
6 ment under the five-minute rule. At the conclusion of the
7 consideration of the bill for amendment the Committee
8 shall rise and report the bill to the House with such
9 amendments as may have been adopted. The previous
10 question shall be considered as ordered on the bill and
11 amendments thereto to final passage without intervening
12 motion except one motion to recommit, with or without
13 instructions.
