Mr. MOAKLEY, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

## RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 3425) to redesignate the Environmental Protection Agency as the Department of Environmental Protection, and for other purposes.

1       *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this  
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 1(b) of  
3 rule XXIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee  
4 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-  
5 ation of the bill (H.R. 3425) to redesignate the Environ-  
6 mental Protection Agency as the Department of Environ-

1 mental Protection, and for other purposes. The first read-  
2 ing of the bill shall be dispensed with. All points of order  
3 against consideration of the bill are waived. General de-  
4 bate shall be confined to the bill and the amendments  
5 made in order by this resolution and shall not exceed one  
6 hour equally divided and controlled by the chairman and  
7 ranking minority member of the Committee on Govern-  
8 ment Operations. After general debate the bill shall be  
9 considered for amendment under the five-minute rule. It  
10 shall be in order to consider as an original bill for the  
11 purpose of amendment under the five-minute rule the  
12 amendment in the nature of a substitute recommended by  
13 the Committee on Government Operations now printed in  
14 the bill. The committee amendment in the nature of a sub-  
15 stitute shall be considered as read. All points of order  
16 against the committee amendment in the nature of a sub-  
17 stitute are waived. No amendment to the committee  
18 amendment in the nature of a substitute shall be in order  
19 except those printed in the report of the Committee on  
20 Rules accompanying this resolution. Each amendment  
21 may be offered only in the order printed in the report,  
22 may be offered only by a Member designated in the report,  
23 shall be considered as read, shall be debatable for the time  
24 specified in the report equally divided and controlled by  
25 the proponent and an opponent, shall not be subject to

1 amendment, and shall not be subject to a demand for divi-  
2 sion of the question in the House or in the Committee  
3 of the Whole. All points of order against the amendment  
4 numbered 9 in the report are waived. At the conclusion  
5 of consideration of the bill for amendment the Committee  
6 shall rise and report the bill to the House with such  
7 amendments as may have been adopted. Any Member may  
8 demand a separate vote in the House on any amendment  
9 adopted in the Committee of the Whole to the bill or to  
10 the committee amendment in the nature of a substitute.  
11 The previous question shall be considered as ordered on  
12 the bill and amendments thereto to final passage without  
13 intervening motion except one motion to recommit with  
14 or without instructions.
