Mr. CLINGER (for himself, Mr. LIVINGSTON, Mr. PACKARD, and Mr. DOOLITTLE) submitted the following resolution; which was referred to the Committee on House Administration

## RESOLUTION

Directing the Architect of the Capitol to place a public debt  
clock in the Cannon House Office Building.

1       *Resolved,*

2       **SECTION 1. PLACEMENT OF PUBLIC DEBT CLOCK.**

3       (a) LOCATION.—The Architect of the Capitol shall  
4 design, construct, and maintain a public debt clock (here-  
5 inafter in this section referred to as the “clock”) in the  
6 basement rotunda of the Cannon House Office Building.  
7 The clock shall be adjusted on a continuous basis to reflect  
8 the amount of the public debt of the United States.

1 (b) NO FEDERAL FUNDS.—No appropriated Federal  
2 funds may be used for the design, construction, or mainte-  
3 nance of the clock.

4 (c) GIFTS AND BEQUESTS.—The Architect may ac-  
5 cept, use, and dispose of gifts and bequests of money for  
6 the purposes of this section.

7 (d) REPORT.—The Architect shall submit to the  
8 Speaker and the Minority Leader of the House of Rep-  
9 resentatives an annual report containing an accounting of  
10 the acceptance, use, and disposition of gifts and bequests  
11 of money under this section, including an accounting of  
12 the amount of money accepted and used under this section  
13 and the source of such money.
