Mr. GORDON, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 3400) to provide a more effective, efficient, and responsive government.

1 *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 1(b) of
3 rule XXIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee
4 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-
5 ation of the bill (H.R. 3400) to provide a more effective,
6 efficient, and responsive government. The first reading of
7 the bill shall be dispensed with. All points or order against
8 consideration of the bill are waived. General debate shall

1 be confined to the bill and the amendments made in order
2 by this resolution and shall not exceed one hour equally
3 divided and controlled by the Majority Leader and the Mi-
4 nority Leader. After general debate the bill shall be con-
5 sidered for amendment under the five-minute rule. In lieu
6 of the committee amendments now printed in the bill, the
7 amendment in the nature of a substitute specified in part
8 1 of the report of the Committee on Rules accompanying
9 this resolution shall be considered as adopted in the House
10 and in the Committee of the Whole. The bill, as so amend-
11 ed, shall be considered as the original bill for the purpose
12 of further amendment. All points of order against the bill,
13 as so amended, are waived. The bill, as so amended, shall
14 be considered as read. No amendment to the bill, as so
15 amended, shall be in order except those printed in part
16 2 of the report of the Committee on Rules. Each amend-
17 ment may be offered and shall be disposed of only in the
18 order printed in the report, may be offered only by a Mem-
19 ber designated in the report, shall be considered as read,
20 shall be debatable under the terms specified in the report,
21 shall not be subject to amendment except as specified in
22 the report, and shall not be subject to a demand for divi-
23 sion of the question in the House or in the Committee
24 of the Whole. All points of order against the amendments
25 printed in the report are waived. At the conclusion of con-

1 sideration of the bill for amendment the Committee shall
2 rise and report the bill, as so amended, to the House with
3 such further amendment as may have been adopted. Any
4 Member may demand a separate vote in the House on any
5 amendment adopted in the Committee of the Whole to the
6 bill, as so amended, or to any further amendment in the
7 nature of a substitute adopted in the Committee of the
8 Whole. The previous question shall be considered as or-
9 dered on the bill, as so amended, and any amendment
10 thereto to final passage without intervening motion except
11 one motion to recommit, which may not include instruc-
12 tions.
