Mr. FROST submitted the following resolution; which was referred to the Committee on House Administration

RESOLUTION

Providing amounts from the contingent fund of the House for the expenses of investigations and studies by certain committees of the House in the second session of the One Hundred Third Congress.

1 *Resolved*, That there shall be paid out of the contin-
2 gent fund of the House in accordance with this primary
3 expense resolution not more than the amount specified in
4 section 2 for investigations and studies by each committee
5 named in such section, including expenses—

6 (1) in the case of a committee named in section
7 3, for procurement of consultant services under sec-

1 tion 202(i) of the Legislative Reorganization Act of
2 1946; and

3 (2) in the case of a committee named in section
4 4, for provision of assistance for members of profes-
5 sional staff in obtaining specialized training under
6 section 202(j) of such Act.

7 SEC. 2. The committees and amounts referred to in
8 the first section are: Committee on Agriculture,
9 \$2,257,937; Committee on Armed Services, \$2,669,197;
10 Committee on Banking, Finance and Urban Affairs,
11 \$4,188,650; Committee on the District of Columbia,
12 \$342,035; Committee on Education and Labor,
13 \$4,238,064; Committee on Energy and Commerce,
14 \$6,608,907; Committee on Foreign Affairs, \$4,145,214;
15 Committee on Government Operations, \$3,282,875; Com-
16 mittee on House Administration, \$1,994,288; Permanent
17 Select Committee on Intelligence, \$104,500; Committee
18 on the Judiciary, \$2,734,853; Committee on Merchant
19 Marine and Fisheries, \$2,395,679; Committee on Natural
20 Resources, \$2,243,095; Committee on Post Office and
21 Civil Service, \$1,889,736; Committee on Public Works
22 and Transportation, \$3,170,666; Committee on Rules,
23 \$722,479; Committee on Science, Space, and Technology,
24 \$2,959,438; Committee on Small Business, \$1,073,000;
25 Committee on Standards of Official Conduct, \$100,000;

1 Committee on Veterans' Affairs, \$827,034; and Commit-
2 tee on Ways and Means, \$5,070,000.

3 SEC. 3. (a) Of the amounts provided for in section
4 2, each committee named in subsection (b) may use not
5 more than the amount specified in such subsection for
6 consultant services under paragraph (1) of the first
7 section.

8 (b) The committees and amounts referred to in sub-
9 section (a) are: Committee on Agriculture, \$12,000; Com-
10 mittee on Armed Services, \$40,000; Committee on the
11 District of Columbia, \$8,000; Committee on Education
12 and Labor, \$100,000; Committee on Energy and Com-
13 merce, \$25,000; Committee on Government Operations,
14 \$10,000; Committee on House Administration, \$225,000;
15 Committee on Natural Resources, \$2,500; Committee on
16 Post Office and Civil Service, \$60,000; Committee on
17 Public Works and Transportation, \$50,000; Committee on
18 Science, Space, and Technology, \$25,000; Committee on
19 Standards of Official Conduct, \$45,000; Committee on
20 Veterans' Affairs, \$18,750; and Committee on Ways and
21 Means, \$10,000.

22 SEC. 4. (a) Of the amounts provided for in section
23 2, each committee named in subsection (b) may use not
24 more than the amount specified in such subsection for spe-
25 cialized training under paragraph (2) of the first section.

1 (b) The committees and amounts referred to in sub-
2 section (a) are: Committee on Agriculture, \$2,000; Com-
3 mittee on Armed Services, \$8,000; Committee on the Dis-
4 trict of Columbia, \$1,000; Committee on Education and
5 Labor, \$10,000; Committee on Government Operations,
6 \$2,000; Committee on House Administration, \$20,000;
7 Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence, \$5,000;
8 Committee on the Judiciary, \$5,000; Committee on Natu-
9 ral Resources, \$100; Committee on Public Works and
10 Transportation, \$30,000; Committee on Rules, \$2,500;
11 Committee on Science, Space, and Technology, \$19,032;
12 Committee on Standards of Official Conduct, \$1,000; and
13 Committee on Veterans' Affairs, \$1,500.

14 SEC. 5. In addition to any other activity referred to
15 in this resolution, the Committee on House Administra-
16 tion, using funds from the amount specified with respect
17 to that Committee in section 2—

18 (1) shall, through House Information Systems,
19 develop, operate, maintain, and improve computer
20 and information services for the House, including di-
21 rect computer and information systems support for
22 Members, committees, administrative offices, and
23 other governmental entities, and shall conduct nec-
24 essary investigations and studies of such services;

1 (2) is authorized to oversee any reimbursement
2 for services described in paragraph (1) and any ex-
3 penditure of amounts so reimbursed; and

4 (3) is authorized to provide for professional de-
5 velopment programs, office and personnel manage-
6 ment consultation services, and periodic publication
7 of handbooks, guides, bulletins, and other items nec-
8 essary for the House.

9 SEC. 6. Payments under this resolution shall be made
10 on vouchers authorized by the committee involved, signed
11 by the chairman of such committee, and approved by the
12 Committee on House Administration.

13 SEC. 7. Amounts shall be available under this resolu-
14 tion for investigations and studies carried out during the
15 period beginning at noon on January 3, 1994, and ending
16 immediately before noon on January 3, 1995.

17 SEC. 8. Amounts made available under this resolution
18 shall be expended in accordance with regulations pre-
19 scribed by the Committee on House Administration.
