Ms. SNOWE submitted the following resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Rules

RESOLUTION

Providing for the consideration of the bill (H.R. 3266) to provide for automatic downward adjustments in the discretionary spending limits for fiscal year 1994 set forth in the Congressional Budget Act of 1974 equal to the amount of rescissions contained in this Act.

1 *Resolved*, That immediately following the approval of
2 the Journal on any of the next five legislative days of
3 House session, it shall be in order as a matter of the high-
4 est privilege for Representative Andrews of New Jersey,
5 or a designee, to move that the House resolve itself into
6 the Committee of the Whole House on the State of the
7 Union for the consideration of the bill (H.R. 3266) to pro-

1 vide for automatic downward adjustments in the discre-
2 tionary spending limits for fiscal year 1994 set forth in
3 the Congressional Budget Act of 1974 equal to the
4 amount of rescissions contained in this Act, the first read-
5 ing of the bill shall be dispensed with, and all points of
6 order against the bill and its consideration are waived.
7 After general debate, which shall be confined to the bill
8 and which shall not exceed one hour, to be equally divided
9 and controlled by Representative Andrews of New Jersey
10 and a Member opposed thereto, the bill shall be considered
11 for amendment under the five-minute rule, and each sec-
12 tion shall be considered as having been read. No amend-
13 ment to the bill shall be in order unless printed in the
14 Congressional Record at least two days prior to its consid-
15 eration. It shall be in order to consider any such amend-
16 ment to the bill that would have the effect of reducing
17 budget authority or outlays and all points of order against
18 any such amendment are hereby waived, except that any
19 amendment to the bill that does not have the effect of re-
20 ducing budget authority or outlays or in which such reduc-
21 tion is merely an incidental provision shall not be in order.
22 No amendment to an amendment shall be in order unless
23 germane to the amendment to which it is offered. At the
24 conclusion of the consideration of the bill for amendment,
25 the Committee shall rise and report the bill to the House

1 with such amendments as may have been adopted. The
2 previous question shall be considered as ordered on the
3 bill and amendments thereto to final passage without in-
4 tervening motion except one motion to recommit. Once the
5 bill is taken up, it shall remain the unfinished business
6 as a matter of the highest privilege on each succeeding
7 day immediately after the approval of the Journal until
8 finally disposed of.

9 SEC. 2. For the purpose of amendments made in
10 order by this resolution, the levels of budget authority and
11 outlays for a fiscal year shall be determined on the basis
12 of estimates made by the Committee on the Budget.

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
