Mr. BONIOR, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 3937) entitled the “Export Administration Act of 1994”.

1 *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 1(b) of
3 rule XXIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee
4 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-
5 ation of the bill (H.R. 3937) entitled the “Export Admin-
6 istration Act of 1994”. The first reading of the bill shall
7 be dispensed with. General debate shall be confined to the
8 bill and the amendments made in order by this resolution

1 and shall not exceed ninety minutes, with fifteen minutes
2 equally divided and controlled by the chairman and rank-
3 ing minority member of the Committee on Foreign Affairs,
4 fifteen minutes equally divided and controlled by the chair-
5 man and ranking minority member of the Committee on
6 Armed Services, fifteen minutes equally divided and con-
7 trolled by the chairman and ranking minority member of
8 the Committee on the Judiciary, fifteen minutes equally
9 divided and controlled by the chairman and ranking mi-
10 nority member of the Committee on Public Works and
11 Transportation, fifteen minutes equally divided and con-
12 trolled by the chairman and ranking minority member of
13 the Committee on Ways and Means, and fifteen minutes
14 equally divided and controlled by the chairman and rank-
15 ing minority member of the Permanent Select Committee
16 on Intelligence. After general debate the bill shall be con-
17 sidered for amendment under the five-minute rule. In lieu
18 of the committee amendments now printed in the bill, it
19 shall be in order to consider as an original bill for the
20 purpose of amendment under the five-minute rule an
21 amendment in the nature of a substitute consisting of the
22 text of H.R. 4663. That amendment in the nature of a
23 substitute shall be considered by title rather than by sec-
24 tion, and each title shall be considered as read. All points
25 of order against that amendment in the nature of a sub-

1 stitute are waived. No amendment directly or indirectly
2 changing section 111(c)(2)(B)(iii), 111(d)(4)(F),
3 111(e)(3), or 226(b)(8) of the amendment in the nature
4 of a substitute made in order as original text shall be in
5 order. No amendment affecting the subject of timber shall
6 be in order. It shall be in order to consider the amend-
7 ments printed in the report of the Committee on Rules
8 accompanying this resolution only in the order printed.
9 Each amendment printed in the report may be offered
10 only by a Member designated in the report, shall be con-
11 sidered as read, shall be debatable for the time specified
12 in the report equally divided and controlled by the pro-
13 ponent and an opponent, shall not be subject to amend-
14 ment, and shall not be subject to a demand for division
15 of the question in the House or in the Committee of the
16 Whole. All points of order against the amendments printed
17 in the report are waived. If more than one of the amend-
18 ments printed in the report is adopted, only the last to
19 be adopted shall be considered as finally adopted and re-
20 ported to the House. Except as provided in section 2 of
21 this resolution, no other amendment (other than a further
22 amendment in the nature of a substitute) may directly or
23 indirectly change a portion of the amendment in the na-
24 ture of a substitute made in order as original text ad-
25 dressed by an amendment printed in the report. Except

1 as provided in section 3, no other amendment to the
2 amendment in the nature of a substitute made in order
3 as original text shall be in order unless printed in the por-
4 tion of the Congressional Record designated for that pur-
5 pose in clause 6 of rule XXIII before the commencement
6 of consideration of the bill. At the conclusion of consider-
7 ation of the bill for amendment the Committee shall rise
8 and report the bill to the House with such amendments
9 as may have been finally adopted. Any Member may de-
10 mand a separate vote in the House on any amendment
11 finally adopted in the Committee of the Whole to the bill
12 or to the amendment in the nature of a substitute made
13 in order as original text. The previous question shall be
14 considered as ordered on the bill and amendments thereto
15 to final passage without intervening motion except one
16 motion to recommit with or without instructions.

17 SEC. 2. It shall be in order immediately after the dis-
18 position of the amendments printed in the report of the
19 Committee on Rules accompanying this resolution to con-
20 sider additional amendments directly or indirectly chang-
21 ing a portion of the amendment in the nature of a sub-
22 stitute made in order as original text addressed by an
23 amendment printed in the report of the Committee on
24 Rules, if offered by a Member designated jointly by the
25 chairman and ranking minority member of the Committee

1 on Foreign Affairs and the chairman and ranking minor-
2 ity member of the Committee on Armed Services. All
3 points of order against such additional amendments are
4 waived.

5 SEC. 3. It shall be in order at any time for the chair-
6 man of the Committee on Foreign Affairs or a designee
7 to offer amendments en bloc consisting of amendments
8 otherwise in order to the amendment in the nature of a
9 substitute made in order as original text or germane modi-
10 fications of any such amendment. Amendments en bloc of-
11 fered pursuant to this section shall be considered as read
12 (except that modifications shall be reported), shall be de-
13 batable for ten minutes equally divided and controlled by
14 the chairman and ranking minority member of the Com-
15 mittee on Foreign Affairs, shall not be subject to amend-
16 ment, and shall not be subject to a demand for division
17 of the question in the House or in the Committee of the
18 Whole. For the purpose of inclusion in such amendments
19 en bloc, an amendment printed in the form of a motion
20 to strike may be modified to the form of a germane per-
21 fecting amendment to the text originally proposed to be
22 stricken. All points of order against such amendments en
23 bloc are waived. The original proponent of an amendment
24 included in such amendments en bloc may insert a state-

- 1 ment in the Congressional Record immediately before the
- 2 disposition of the amendments en bloc.
